HOW TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID*

1. Submit this Application to the Financial Aid Office. Be sure to answer every question. **LEAVE NO BLANKS.** If a question does not apply to you, write "Not Applicable" or "None". **Be sure to keep copies for your reference.**

2. Be sure to complete the Expense/Income statement on the front page of this application for the period from September 2003 through June 2004. This is not a projection of expected expense and income for '04-05 school year, but it is a statement of expense and income for the period preceding that for which you are requesting aid. If you received more than \$1,000 from your parents in any form (such as tuition payments, loans, gifts), you must provide their information and signatures on this form, and submit their tax forms or salary documentation. International students, see "INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS", page 4.

3. Follow all instructions below which apply to you. For example: if you are a new international student be sure to read "**NEW STUDENTS**" and "**INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**".

DRAMA AND DANCE STUDENTS — Wherever you are asked to indicate your year in college, remember that your program is considered undergraduate, not graduate or professional.

NEW STUDENTS: The deadline for filing all forms is March 1, 2004 (File FAFSA in February).

2. U.S. citizens and Permanent Residents, complete the 2004-2005 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You should have completed at least pages one and two of your/your parents' Federal Income Tax Returns for 2003 before completing the FAFSA. The Juilliard School FAFSA Code is **002742**. Send the FAFSA to the U.S. Dept. of Education via mail or internet (www.fafsa.ed.gov). **[International students, see "INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS" on page 4.]**

3. Send a complete, signed copy of your/your parents' Federal Income Tax returns, including W2 and/or 1099 forms for 2003 to the Financial Aid Office as soon as possible. If you or your parents did not file tax forms, you should send a statement indicating that you/your parents were not required to file, listing any form of income and include documentation, if possible. **[International students, see "INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS" on page 4.]**

4. Submit a resume or a brief professional biography along with this application.

RETURNING STUDENTS: The deadline for filing all forms is April 1, 2004 (File FAFSA in March).
(If you are applying to a new program, the deadline is March 1, 2004.)

1. Submit this signed application to the Financial Aid Office.

2. If you receive a FAFSA Renewal Application in the mail, follow the instructions provided for filing. If you do not receive a Renewal Application by February 1, file your FAFSA on the Web (www.fafsa.ed.gov) by March 1, 2004. Complete at least pages one and two of your/your parents' Federal Income Tax Returns before completing the FAFSA. Be sure you are filing the 2004-05 FAFSA. **[International students, see "INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS" on page 4.]**

3. Send a complete, signed copy of your/your parents' Federal Income Tax Returns, including W2 and/or 1099 forms for 2003. If you or your parents did not file tax forms, you should send a non-filing tax statement including any form of income and include documentation. **[International students, see "INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS" on page 4.]**

4. Submit a resumé or brief professional biography along with this application.

***FINANCIAL AID includes scholarship, grants, loans and work study. All scholarships are based on merit and need, therefore all forms must be submitted. Students must apply each year. Lateness may result in loss of all or part of scholarship assistance.**

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

1. ALL International students must:

- a) Submit a Juilliard Financial Aid application to the Financial Aid Office.
- b) Complete the enclosed International Student Financial Supplement. Please convert all figures to U.S. dollars. Submit the Supplement to the Financial Aid Office.
- c) Submit your parents' tax forms from your country for the most recent tax year available as of March 1, 2004. Submit the forms that show total income and total taxes paid. You must provide an English translation.
- d) If your country does not have tax forms, you may submit an official letter from your parents' employers stating their total incomes from January to December, 2003, or you may submit a letter from your sponsor indicating the total support expected for the 2004-2005 school year.
- e) If your parents are not providing any support for you, you must submit documentation which shows how you supported yourself during the 2003-04 year.

2. NEW International Students: The deadline for filing all forms is MARCH 1, 2004.

3. RETURNING International Students: The deadline for filing all forms is APRIL 1, 2004 (If you are applying to a new program, the deadline is MARCH 1, 2004.)

4. Submit a resumé or a brief professional biography along with this application.

NEW YORK STATE RESIDENTS

If you qualify according to the guidelines listed below and follow all the instructions, you may receive a Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) grant. Please note: non-residents who begin full-time study in NY during their first year of residing in NY are not eligible for TAP, even though they may have resided in N.Y.S. for 12 or more months. To qualify:

1. File a FAFSA and New York State Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) Application.
2. Use a New York State address on your FAFSA and indicate New York as state of legal residence.
3. Maintain a New York State residence from September 2003 through May 2005.
4. If you hold a valid driver's license, it must be from New York State.
5. If you are registered to vote, it must be in New York State.
6. If you are dependent, your parents must be residents of New York State.
7. You must be a U.S. citizen or Permanent Resident.
8. You must maintain full-time enrollment and a "C" average.

Please note that The Juilliard School reserves the right to make adjustments in scholarships, loans and work study based on receipt of TAP grants and/or other grants or scholarships.
