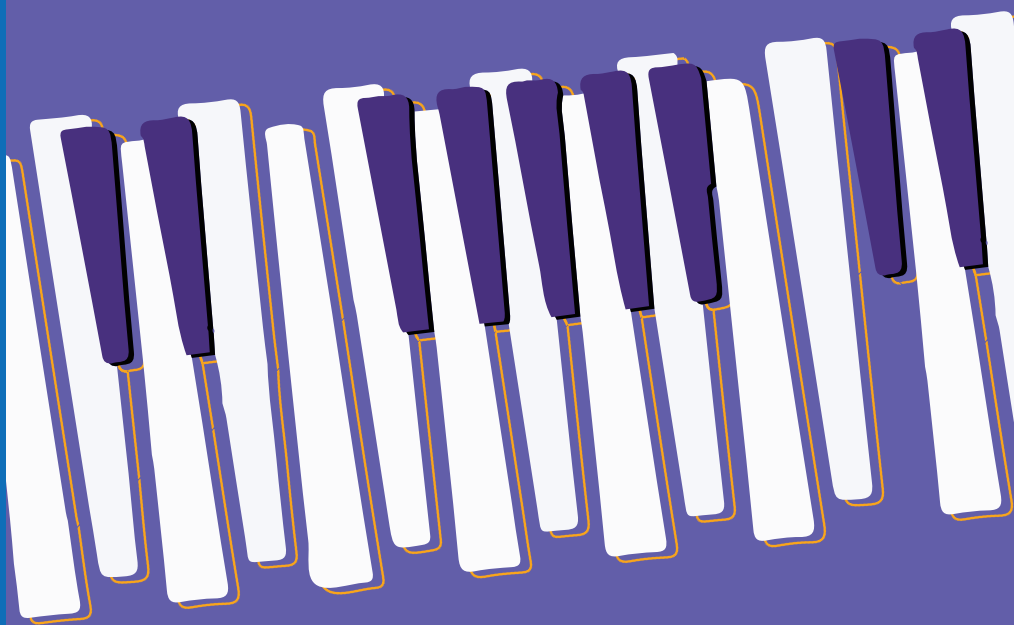

Meet the Artists



Huan Li

Huan Li is currently pursuing her bachelor's degree with Hung-Kuan Chen at Juilliard. Born in Guangdong, China, in 1997, she began learning the piano at the age of 5. In 2008, she was admitted to the Central Conservatory of Music's pre-college division, where she worked with Wu Yuan. In 2012, she moved to the U.S. to attend Juilliard's Pre-College and has studied with Yonghi Moon, Choong Mo Kang, and Hung-Kuan Chen. As a solo pianist, she has performed at the Hungarian Embassy in China, Forbidden City Concert Hall, and National Grand Theater. She was a substitute soloist for Andreas Haefliger in the Aspen Music Festival and School, and she has played with the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, Salzburg Chamber Soloists, and Juilliard Chamber Orchestra. She has participated in a number of competitions where she won top prizes, including the first Zhuhai International Mozart Competition, PianoArts North American Piano Competition, Roslyn Tureck Bach International Competition, and Kosciuszko Foundation's 65th Chopin Piano Competition.

Zhu Wang

Pianist Zhu Wang is currently pursuing his Bachelor of Music at Juilliard with Robert McDonald. He is the first-prize winner of the second Zhuhai International Mozart Competition for Young Musicians and the Hilton Head Young Artist Piano Competition, and he has been a featured soloist on Chicago WFMT's Myra Hess Memorial Concert Series. Highlights of his 2017-18 season included recitals in Los Angeles, Chicago, New York, Houston, and Santa Barbara, the result of his winning the solo piano competition at the Music Academy of the West. He has also appeared as a soloist with the Hilton Head Symphony and Salzburg Chamber Soloists, among others, and has worked with many distinguished pianists, including Gary Graffman, Fou Ts'ong, Stephen Hough, and Murray Perahia. His previous instructors include Xiaofeng Zheng and Wenhong Chen.

Jocelyn Zhu

A native of Jackson, Mississippi, violinist Jocelyn Zhu began her university studies at age 14 at Belhaven University in both pre-med and violin, graduating cum laude. She subsequently earned her Master of Music from Juilliard in 2017, studying with Catherine Cho and Hyo Kang. Her musical journey has taken her to Asia, Europe, and North America, and she has worked with renowned musicians in the classical, pop, and jazz genres. She has been featured on ABC, PBS, *Good Morning America*, and *The Today Show* and has played for dignitaries and celebrities worldwide. She is a recipient of a Juilliard School career grant, the National Trustees Grant, and the Performing Arts Consortium Grant. She founded and is the artistic director of the Melita Ensemble Concert Series in New York. Last year, she was the recipient of the Tarisio Trust Young Artists Grant and the U.S. Embassy Berlin Grant for her work as co-founder (with Mariella Haubs) of Concerts for Compassion—a project created to cross cultural boundaries through music to support and connect people worldwide. This initiative has affected local communities and refugee camps throughout Europe, reaching more than 30 countries since its 2017 launch.



Mariella Haubs

Violinist Mariella Haubs holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Juilliard, where she studied as a Kovner Fellow with Catherine Cho and Itzhak Perlman. She has performed throughout Europe, North America, Asia, and the Middle East, and in 2014 performed at the United Nations General Assembly at the invitation of Barack and Michelle Obama. She has received numerous awards including the Leonhard and Ida Wolf Memorial Prize of the City of Munich and the Tarisio Trust Young Artists Grant. *Glamour* magazine named her one of its Top 10 College Women of 2014. She is a delegate of the Academy of Achievement as well as an alumna of the Perlman Music Program and the National YoungArts Foundation. Between ages 10 and 14, she performed as a violinist, pianist, and actress in more than 200 children's concerts led by the Munich Philharmonic, bringing the work and life stories of famous composers to children around Europe. A passionate teacher, she has taught all ages in her private teaching studio and as a substitute teacher at Juilliard's Pre-College, the Perlman Music Program, and the Noel Pointer Foundation. In 2017 she co-founded (with Jocelyn Zhu) Concerts for Compassion, a project which brings live music to refugees and displaced peoples, reaching more than 30 countries and touring Latin America with the United Nations Refugee Agency this season.



The Harold W. McGraw, Jr. Family Foundation Young Artists Showcase

Tonight's performance launches the 41st season of The McGraw Family Foundation Young Artists Showcase. Since its first season in 1978, the program has introduced more than 3,000 gifted musicians to the on-air audience. The Young Artists Showcase is broadcast on WQXR (105.9 FM) every Wednesday at 9pm and features performances by some of today's most promising musicians.

The Gina Bachauer Memorial Scholarship Fund

The Gina Bachauer Memorial Scholarship Fund for gifted pianists was established at Juilliard in 1979 through a bequest from the late Lillian Rogers of New Orleans. Mrs. Rogers had been a lifelong friend of the eminent pianist Gina Bachauer, who died in 1976. It was Mrs. Rogers's wish to honor, in a tangible, permanent manner, Ms. Bachauer, whose artistry, compassion, and humanity she so admired. Recipients are chosen through an annual competition at Juilliard.

The Harold W. McGraw, Jr. Family Foundation Robert Sherman Award

The McGraw Family Foundation Robert Sherman Award was created in 2002 to honor radio personality, journalist, author, concert narrator, and teacher Robert Sherman and to mark the 25th anniversary of the Young Artists Showcase. To foster excellence in music education at the community level, the award recognizes a Juilliard alumnus or alumna for leadership in providing enrichment to broad audiences through music education programs as well as for outstanding musicianship. The winner is provided with a \$10,000 grant to further his or her mission in music education and community outreach and is selected upon recommendation by Juilliard.
