

Jennifer Koh

Violinist and Juilliard Creative Associate Jennifer Koh is recognized for her intense, commanding performances, delivered with dazzling virtuosity and technical assurance. A forward-thinking artist, she is dedicated to exploring a broad and eclectic repertoire, while promoting equity and inclusivity in classical music. She has expanded the contemporary violin repertoire through a wide range of commissioning projects, and has premiered more than 100 works written especially for her. Koh's series include Alone Together, a commissioning project and performances series in support of composers during the coronavirus crisis; The New American Concerto, which invites a diverse collective of composers to examine sociocultural topics relevant to American life today through the form of the violin concerto; and Bach and Beyond, which traces the history of the solo violin repertoire from Bach's sonatas and partitas to pieces by 20th- and 21st-century composers. Koh has appeared with orchestras worldwide, among them the New York, Los Angeles, and Helsinki philharmonics; Cleveland, Mariinsky, Minnesota. Philadelphia, and Philharmonia (London) orchestras; and Atlanta, Baltimore, BBC, Chicago, Cincinnati, National, New World, NHK, RAI (Torino), and Singapore symphonies. Named Musical America's 2016 Instrumentalist of the Year, she has won the International Tchaikovsky Competition in Moscow, Concert Artists Guild Competition, and an Avery Fisher Career Grant. She has a BA in English literature from Oberlin College and studied at the Curtis Institute, where she worked extensively with Jaime Laredo and Felix Galimir. She is an active lecturer, teacher, and recording artist for Cedille Records; and is the artistic director and founder of the nonprofit arco collaborative.

Nadia Sirota

Juilliard Creative Associate Nadia Sirota's (BM '04, MM '06, viola) career spans solo performances, chamber music, producing, curation, and broadcasting. In all branches of her artistic life, she aims to open classical music up to a broader audience. As a soloist, Sirota has performed with acclaimed orchestras around the world and released four albums of commissioned music. She is a member of the chamber sextet yMusic and has lent her signature sound to a dizzying array of projects, appearing on albums and concert stages with artists including the National, David Bowie, Björk, Paul Simon, Ben Folds, and Anohni. Sirota received a Peabody Award for her podcast Meet the Composer, which she co-created, co-produced, and hosted. Since 2018, she has served as the New York Philharmonic's Creative Partner, a position created for her. She also serves as artist in residence at UCLA's Center for the Art of Performance. Sirota is a member of Bedroom Community, a collective of musically diverse artists who work and collaborate at Reykjavik's Greenhouse Studios.



The Lab: Inspired by *Density 2036* Hosted by Claire Chase, Creative Associate

Claire Chase

Juilliard Creative Associate Claire Chase is a musician, interdisciplinary artist, and educator. Passionately dedicated to the creation of new ecosystems for the music of our time, Chase has given the world premieres of hundreds of new works by a new generation of artists, and in 2013 launched the 24-year commissioning project *Density 2036*. Now in its eighth year, *Density 2036* reimagines the solo flute literature over a quarter-century through commissions, performances, recordings, education and an accessible archive at density2036.org. Chase co-founded the International Contemporary Ensemble in 2001, was named a MacArthur Fellow in 2012, and, in 2017, was warded the Avery Fisher Prize from Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts. Chase is professor of the practice of music at Harvard University and a Collaborative Partner with Esa-Pekka Salonen and the San Francisco Symphony. She lives in Brooklyn.



About Creative Associates at Juilliard

The Creative Associates program, a president's initiative created in 2018 by Damian Woetzel, brings to Juilliard an expanding group of artists in residence whose work exemplifies collaborative and interdisciplinary innovation. A committee of artistic leadership works alongside the Office of the President to select Creative Associates and implement their activities at the school. Each Creative Associate spends time at Juilliard engaging collaboratively with the Juilliard community as well as with fellow Creative Associates through workshops, performances, coachings, public discussions, and other special projects. Building on the rich history of Juilliard's composers, choreographers, and playwrights, the Creative Associates program affirms that creative practice is an essential part of the educational excellence that is the hallmark of Juilliard and champions the unique opportunity for interdisciplinary work between Juilliard's divisions of music, dance, and drama.

About Jazz Ensembles at Juilliard

Each of Juilliard Jazz's small ensembles is named after a jazz legend. This does not mean the named ensemble will solely perform the works of that artist, but invoking these names reminds us, and our audience, of our music's great history and its interconnectedness. In addition, ensemble coaches will incorporate important aspects of each artist's work into their ensemble teaching throughout the year.

- Jelly Roll Morton Ensemble, in the spirit of interpreting the original meanings of jazz, coached by Doug Wamble
- Max Roach Ensemble, in the spirit of Civil Rights experimentation and understanding of the African Diaspora, coached by Roxy Coss
- Mary Lou Williams Ensemble, in the spirit of stride piano, arranging, and intellectual discourse on music techniques and meaning, coached by Bruce Williams
